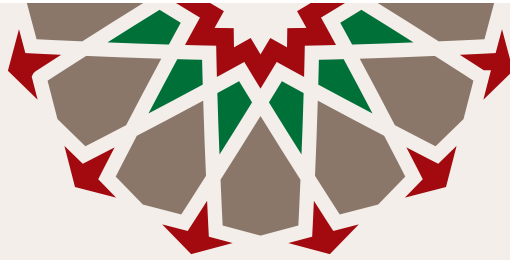

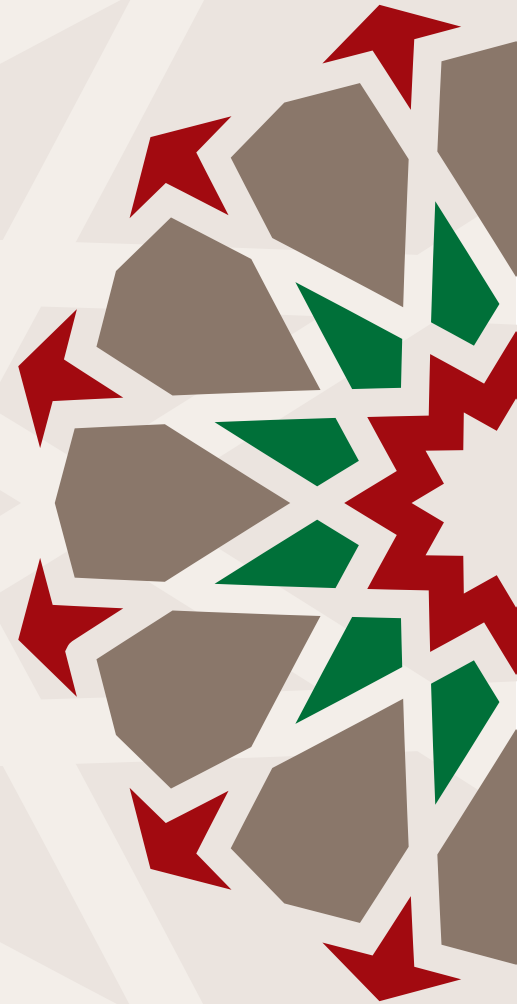

Introductory information

AMA, American Moroccan Alliance, is a non-profit organization focused on fostering inter-cultural understanding in order to dispel common stereotypes and misconceptions. AMA was founded by Dr. Ahmed Yanouri in Dallas, Texas in 2013 in the spirit of building a cultural bridge between the United States and Morocco to develop and sustain amicable relations. The mission of AMA is to build cultural and economic connections between the two countries through dialogue, advocacy and collaborative service and education projects. AMA aims to initiate projects that bring together professionals and ideas from both countries. These projects include organizing educational study programs that allow



for collaboration and exchange between teachers in the U.S. and Morocco, as well as partnering with other non-profit organizations in service learning projects. In addition, AMA will serve as a platform for joint projects and partnerships that promote economic and social development. AMA plans to host seminars, webinars, and conventions that promote and build inter-cultural understanding, both locally and internationally.



Program coordinator

Dr. Ahmed Yanouri is a native of Morocco where he grew up and received his early education. In 1983, he moved to the USA to pursue his graduate studies. In 1990, he graduated with a PhD in molecular Biology and for few years worked as an educator and a researcher. In 1995, he went to become an entrepreneur as he ventured into the business world and started few different businesses. Throughout his professional career and during his school years, Mr. Yanouri gave a lot of his time to volunteer work and has been an active member of many non profit organizations. In 2009, Dr. Yanouri became a board member of World Affairs Council of Dallas/Fort Worth and was the 2010 WorldFest board coordinator. He played a major role in bringing the «Moroccan Village» to Addison and making WorldFest a great success in the 2010 and 2011 editions.

Dr. Yanouri believes that Citizen/Alternative Diplomacy is a very effective way to promote good relationship between nations. He recently founded the American Moroccan Alliance (AMA), a non profit organization to help promote and strengthen the bilateral relationship between Morocco and USA. The Teachers Study Tour to Morocco, a good example of Citizen/Alternative diplomacy is organized by AMA this year and more similar projects are in the pipeline.

Project summary

The Study Tour in Morocco will give the American educators the chance to develop a broad appreciation for the history and Arabo-islamic culture of the kingdom of Morocco whose friendly relations with the United States date back over 200 years. More specifically, the participants will focus on issues related to areas such as Education, Politics, Languages, Civil society, Women issues as powerful traditional and increasingly contemporary forces in Morocco. It is expected that the various site visits and the information provided by the highly-qualified speakers/guides while traveling will be carefully integrated into the academic curriculum of the American schools.

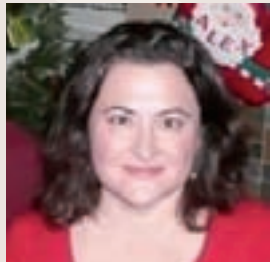

STAN REID

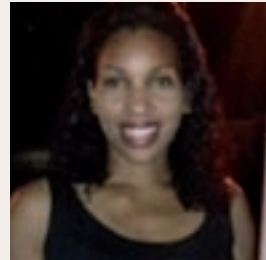

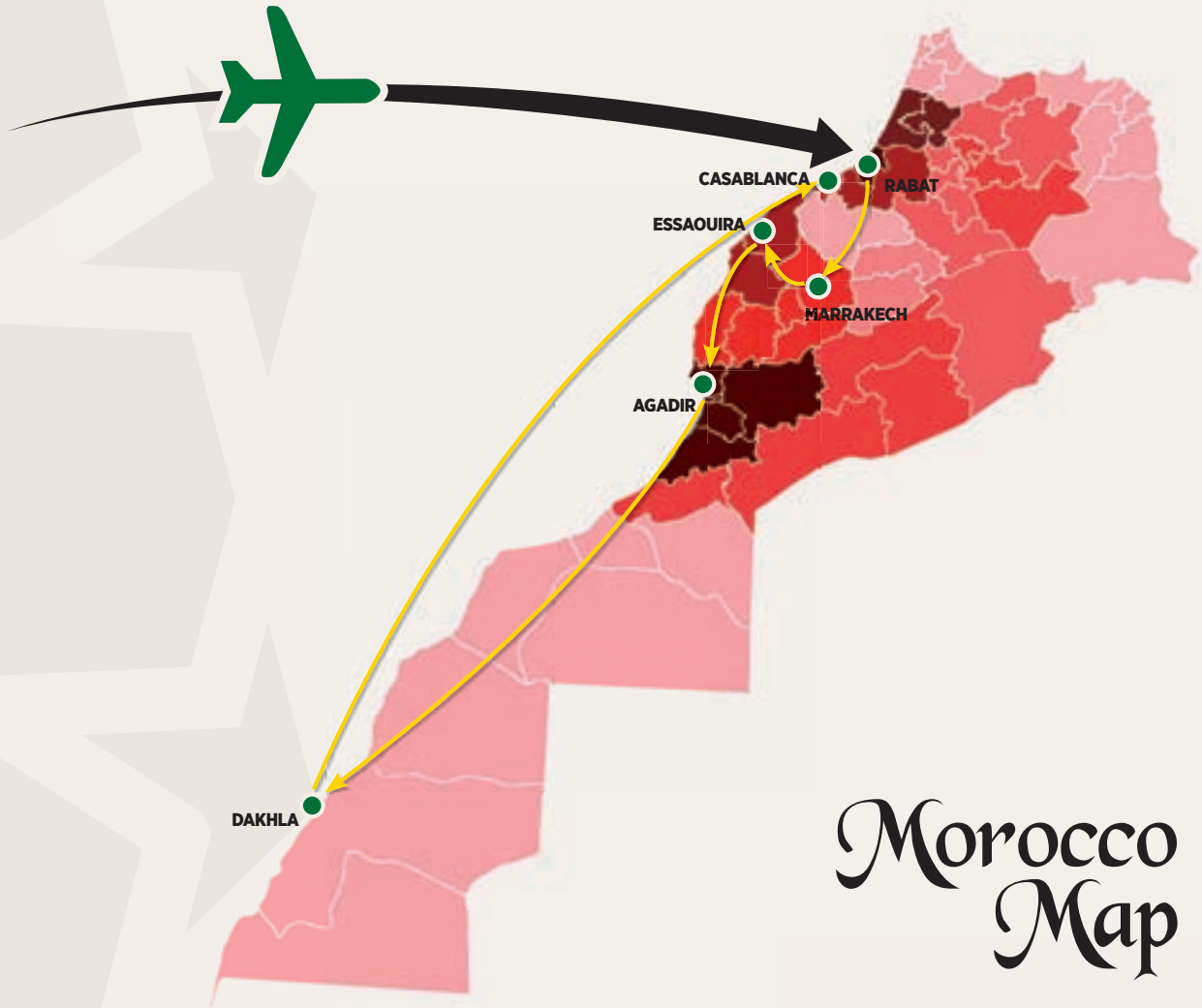

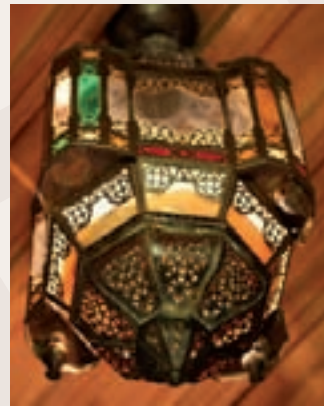
